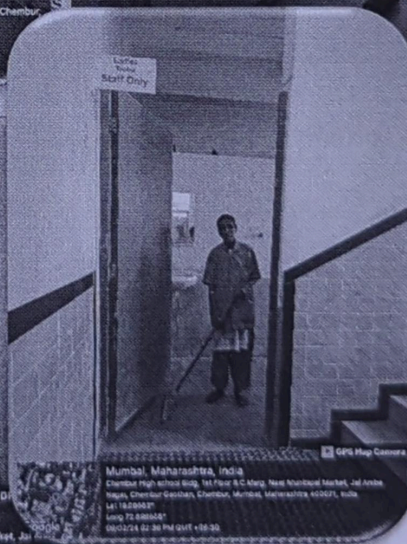
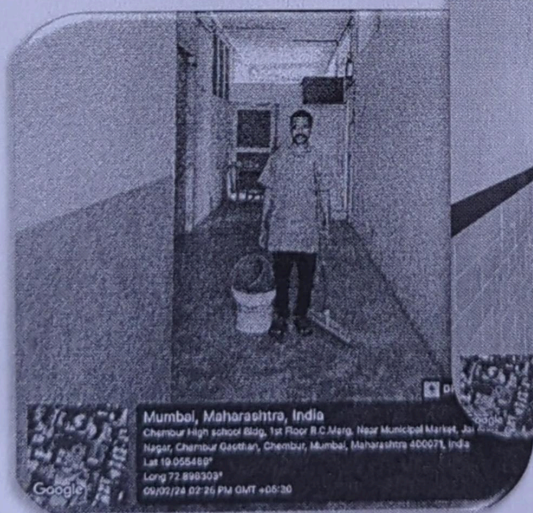
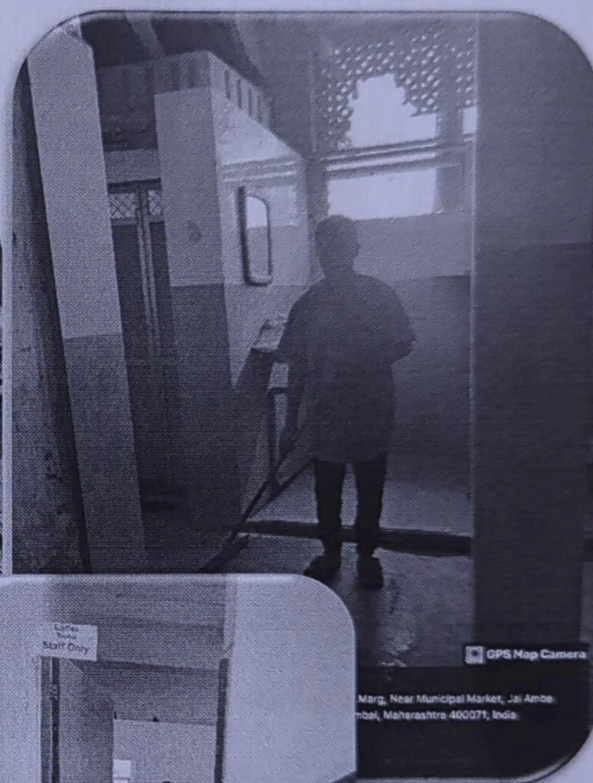

BMC routinely collects the garbage from the institute.

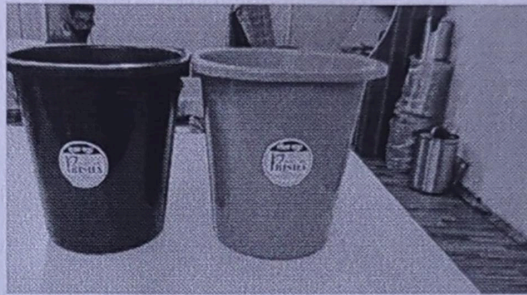
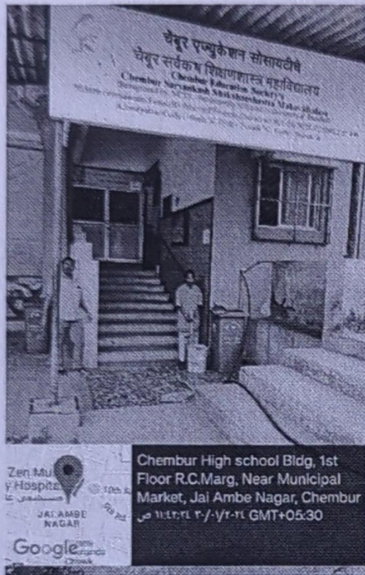
